

# ISPA 2022 Mid-Year Legislative Update

## Purpose and Description of this report

As the Voice of the Mattress Industry®, ISPA actively advocates for the mattress industry’s interests before legislators and regulators at the federal, state and local level. We have prepared this mid-year report to update you on legislation ISPA has tracked and actively worked on so far in 2022 that will or has the potential to affect mattress manufacturers, component suppliers or retailers.

At this point, ISPA has tracked 184 bills in 36 states and the District of Columbia. Of those, 18 bills were enacted and 64 failed, leaving 102 bills currently active during the 2022 legislative session.

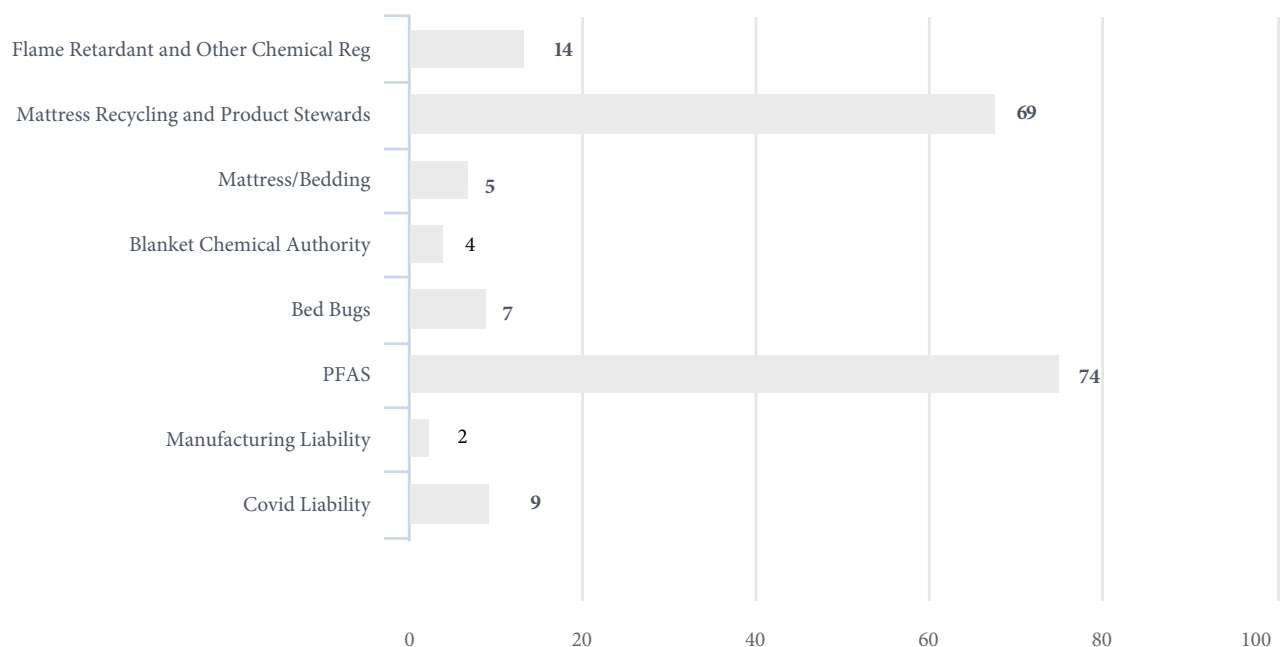
Although the Covid-19 pandemic continued to affect many state legislatures’ operations in 2021, this report nevertheless demonstrates that they were busy working on issues relevant to the mattress industry. They have focused on a broad array of economic and public health and safety related legislation, including those dealing with chemical and environmental regulation.

ISPA will continue to monitor these and other developments closely in the remainder of 2022 and will alert you to significant developments regarding issues that concern our industry.

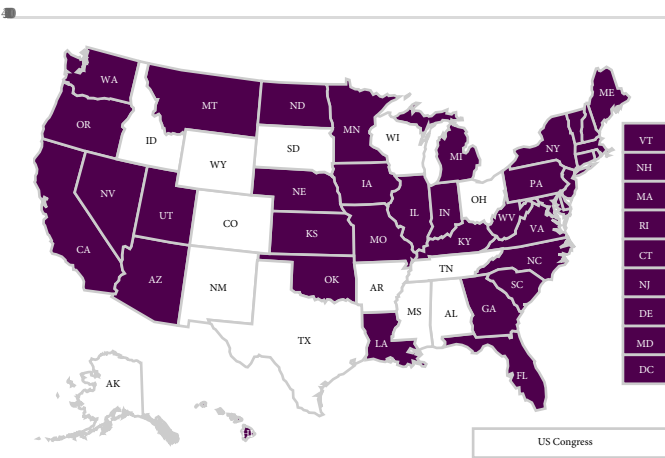
